I am the former County Judge of Bee County and served on several boards and committees including the CEO Council of the Workforce Solutions of the Coastal Bend, Coastal Bend Council of Governments, and the Bee Development Authority. I was instrumental in the formation of the Bee Area Partnership, a public private partnership handling economic development in Bee County. I am also a licensed attorney and served as an assistant attorney general prior to being appointed and later elected as County Judge.

As a former county judge, I fought for economic development in a rural community in an effort to bring good paying jobs to our community. In order to provide social equity, there must be a diverse economy that provides opportunities for all levels of employment. The oil and gas industry has provided stability in communities and gives generations of employees the ability to provide for their families. It is also important to consider the cost to families that the implementation of the CAAP may have in regards to the price of electricity, housing, and transportation. All of which are important to racial and economic justice. Mandates are costly and those costs are typically borne by property owners, who are already being squeezed by local taxes increases that result from State mandates.
	I believe oil and natural gas needs to have a voice in this conversation because we agree that working toward climate progress is a global responsibility. Oil and natural gas companies are investing heavily in new technology that will continue to make a difference in reducing air emissions and protecting the environment. We can share our successes and provide innovative ways in addressing the issue. In fact, the U.S. oil and natural gas industry is the leading

Please explain why you would like to serve on this committee.	investor in low-carbon technology, investing more than \$301.5 billion in greenhouse gas mitigating technologies between 2000-2016. That's more than double the investments by other private sector industries and the federal government, combined. Oil and natural gas companies' investments in innovation have resulted in a 14 percent reduction in methane emissions from oil and natural gas systems since 1990. Domestic natural gas production increased by 50 percent during the same period. Natural gas, now America's leading source of electricity generation, is credited with driving U.S. carbon dioxide (CO2) emissions to their lowest levels since 1992. The U.S. Global Change Research Program reports that North American CO2 emissions from fossil fuel combustion have declined on average by 1 percent per year over the last decade, largely because of reduced reliance on coal, greater use of natural gas, and increased vehicle fuel efficiency standards. These environmental achievements are proof that we don't have to sacrifice economic growth to protect the environment. We can and will continue to do both.
