Coming from a lower class minority groups to working with them directly has given me the unique perspective of knowing what it takes to lift these groups up out of poverty and how to help them create better lives for themselves and future generations.
Please provide a description of your professional, educational and community/volunteer experience.	I obtained my degree in Ecosystem Science and Sustainability from Colorado State University. This degree taught the foundations of social, economic and scientific sustainability. I learned in depth about how urban development effects not only the environment around it, but the people as well. Environmental justice and policy were also large parts of my degree. We studied how Environmental injustice penetrates lower class societies everyday and what needs to be done to correct discriminatory policies that are in place. After graduating I was hired by San Antonio Housing Authority to work in their Sustainability Department. I work assisting in running the Garcia Street Urban Farm, the coordination of new projects, recruitment of different organizations for various social programs we run, building energy audits, and other related tasks. SAHA's Sustainability Initiatives Liaison, Beth Keel, who is also my supervisor has given me the opportunity to sit in with her, and occasionally for her, on various boards she serves on such as the Benchmarking Advisory Committee and SA 2030 District Board. I also volunteer on the Food Policy Council and with the Urban Ag Working Group to help find solutions to San Antonio's food scarcity problems. Sitting in on these boards, groups, and committees has allowed me to see first how to properly and effectively advise on the implementation of city wide plans.

Working in public housing now, I see these issues in my day to day as we work to provide affordable housing for minority groups and improve their quality of life. I understand what it
